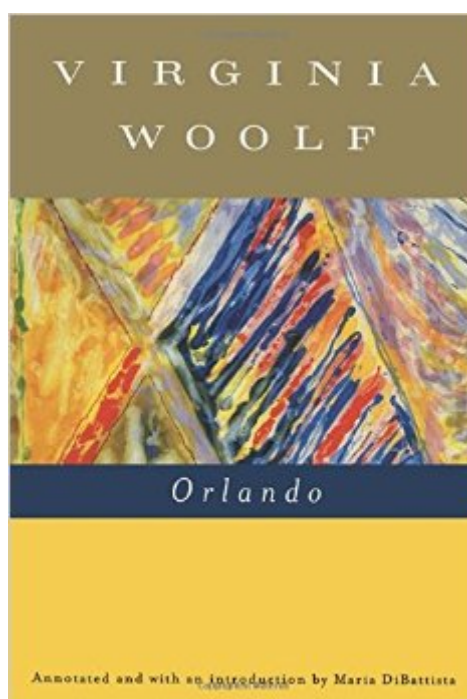

The author of numerous novels, collections of letters, journals, and short stories, she was an admired literary critic and a master of the essay form. Mark Hussey, general editor of Harcourt's annotated Woolf series, is professor of English at Pace University in New York City and editor of the *Woolf Studies Annual*. Maria DiBattista, professor of English and comparative literature at Princeton

University, has written numerous articles on modern literature and film. Her books include *Virginia Woolf: The Fables of Anon*, *First Love: The Affections of Modern Fiction*, and, as coeditor and contributor, *High and Low Moderns: British Literature and Culture 1889-1939*. Her most recent book is *Fast Talking Dames*.
